A special "thank you" to members of Motor City Mountain Biking Association (MCMBA) who have been working ahead of schedule to complete the Settler's Park mountain bike trails. The trail provides 3 individual loops with a total of (nearly) 7 miles of pathway! Along the way, you will find wide sweeping views, mixed terrain, and even some obstacles. Trails are open to both hikers and riders, just be mindful of others and follow sign instructions to keep everyone safe.

The Clerk's Office Needs You! Become an Election Inspector

Hartland Township is seeking Election Inspectors for the upcoming **August 4** and **November 3** elections. Election Inspectors are responsible for setting up polling locations, assisting voters on voting procedures at the polls, distributing ballots, and verifying registration records.

Need to File an Absentee Ballot?

Remember, with changes made to election law last year, absentee voter ballots are now available for all elections. As a registered voter, you can receive a ballot application by contacting the Township Clerk's office. You may also request that the Clerk's office send you an absentee ballot application automatically before each election by filling out a form to be placed on our Permanent Absentee Voter list.
