

At Hartland Township, we had a few local road projects planned for this summer that will now be postponed until 2023.

With major roadways being closed over the warmer months, our local



roads will be seeing increased traffic and congestion. As a response, more dirt roads in the area will receive a limestone cap and Old US-23 will be rehabbed in partnership with LCRC and Federal Funding in 2023. Thanks to our voter approved "Safer Roads Plan", these projects will be completed from designated roads funds and not from Township general funds or an increase in taxes.

Notary Services at the Township Hall

Hartland Township provides notary public service at no charge to residents, taxpayers and business owners. A Notary Public is a public servant appointed by state government to witness the signing of important documents and administer oaths.

Documents are notarized to deter fraud and to ensure they are properly executed. An impartial witness (the Notary) identifies signers to screen out impostors and to make sure they have entered into agreements knowingly and willingly. In order to identify the signer, the Notary will ask to see a current identification document or card with a photograph, physical description and signature. A driver's license, military ID or passport will usually be acceptable.

Please call ahead to make an appointment if you have more than six documents. A Notary is required to witness your signature on a document, so please DO NOT SIGN your documents until the Notary advises you to do so.
